III. TREASURER'S REPORT

- Major expenses this month were on equipment: Mirage splash guard repair \$1000, trailer crank replaced \$40, ama on Makanui and nose on lapa uila: \$1000.
- Income: one crew for MBX, 3 new members to club (brings total membership to 90! Working toward 100 goal)
- Maintenance this year is at \$11,000. Some of these repairs thought to have been avoidable (\$2000-\$2500) Talk to coaches? Discussion: How to manage and control rough use, avoid damage, report damage, look for trends in maintenance and damage costs.
- Credit card with the Credit Union: Bob has filled out the forms, needs to gather the tax forms to move forward.

1. Kudos corner: Thanks to Dave Dyc for replacing broken handle/wheel on trailer & towing the trailer back to Aldo's side of harbor & for inflating flat tire on wheels; thanks to Kim Sides for setting up all of our event sign-ups on google groups; thanks to all who have helped at newbie rec paddle; thanks to those who paddled with Camp Recovery members; thanks to Pam for coordinating the Camp Recovery paddle and for arranging boat repairs for the Mirage and Lapa Uila; thanks to all who rigged canoes; thanks to Yoko for coordinating Shared Adventures and to the many people who volunteered their time; thanks to Bob D for ordering jerseys/t-shirts; thanks to Ruth & Kay for setting up/running Keiki Camp and all the members who helped with canoes, especially Bob D and Duane S who have helped almost every day! Thanks to Dave Dyc for padding the Low Rider wheels.

2. Coaches Corner – remote report

• Crews continue to train for various races. All is well with the racers!

3. Equipment

- Mirage and Lapa Uila are fixed. The Canoe Repairs for last month came to a total of \$1000 for the Mirage Splash Guard, Maka Nui Ama, and nose repair on Lapa Uila.
- Homer Lighthall is doing a great job resurfacing and using a gel coat on the canoes where the wheels and steers' paddles create wear. Considering future maintenance for the Mirage and one Bradley? \$2000 per boat? Homer charges \$60/hr, has a mobile service, is a boat guy. Aquarius is \$80 hr, can do some things that Homer can't as they have a shop. Home is donating a few hours off the bill- Bob will give him an OSC hat from the club store. Next meeting will circle back to which boats to resurface next (Mirage and a Bradley?), and when (Immediately after MBX?)
- Two new rec paddlers have offered to design wheels for us; they can donate their time and will

present materials costs (estimated at \$150) before going forward.

• Need for a cutting tool/diving knife in each dry bag, for emergencies. Ruth will look atWest Marine. Noted we also will need six new dry bags and 6 new radios.

Dave Dyc moves that the club immediately buy two new dry bags and a fishing knife. Nise seconds, all in favor, none oppose.

4. Club Store items for Aloha Festival

• Bob ordered jerseys from Patagonia. Also ordered 24 shirts for Aloha festival and shirts for the keiki program- are coming in.

V. UPDATES & NEW BUSINESS

1. MBX
